Chapter 1

How it all started

It all started on November 18 of 1996 while I was seeking my Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, through prayer and fasting for direction as the New Year 1997 was quickly approaching. What will He have for my family and me? Suddenly, the Lord spoke to me in a very clear and audible voice that He will like my wife and me to migrate to the USA to live permanently to accomplish the work and call of God on our lives. My wife's ministry is singing and teaching God's word. My ministry is preaching and teaching God's truth in a real and dynamic way declaring His will and purpose for man in a lost and dying world.

I wrestled with the Lord concerning this issue because it would require me leaving my beautiful country of birth, Trinidad and Tobago and my private teaching business. Also, working for an institution lecturing Computer Science with an excellent success rate of 92.3 percent over a 13 year period.

I obtained a number of Diplomas in Business Management & Trading, Economics & Commerce, Accounting and Computer Science with emphasis on Software methodology from a very reputable and recognized institution from London, England and several ordinary level subjects. Another very difficult situation for me was giving up the rent free living in my parents 4 bedroom house. Also, the only other expenses Gail and I incurred was the utility bills and miscellaneous expenses which came to only about \$300.00 Trinidad dollars a month which is equivalent to about 45 United States Dollars this was comfortable living by any standard.

This housing arrangement was possible because my parents left Trinidad in March 1990 to secure their permanent residence status. Also, my siblings migrated to the USA in June 1995.

Gail and I met in March 1993 through my sister Carol; they were friends and still are to this day. Through her witness and sweetness I was drawn to the Lord. My sister Carol prayed for me for over 12 years that I would come to know Jesus Christ as my Lord and personal savior. Due to the fact that I was not yet a born-again Christian Gail would not consider me as her fiancé because she was very strict in this manner.

I commended her very much for her stand in this respect. The Bible teaches,

After a couple of weeks with my sister and Gail constantly harassing me to come to their church, I finally accepted their invitation to attend their church on 23 of September 1993 on the basis of just to "shut them up". Suddenly, after about an hour in the church service. I felt the power of God upon me and I walked down to the altar and accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Personal savior.

I, as an assistant to my pastor in Victory, El Dorado, and my wife as the worship director and Church secretary doing His work in the kingdom of God in Trinidad & Tobago. Our annual salary was about \$65,000 Trinidad dollars.

Life for my wife and I was very nice indeed, so the Lord requiring us to move to another country was very challenging due to the reasons mentioned above. Another was fear of the unknown, not knowing where we were going and the lifestyle we were about to encounter. We were leaving our comfort zone, "so to speak", our country of birth, and going to a foreign land which reminded us of Abraham's life.

"Now the Lord had said to Abram, get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee."

I distinctively remember asking the Lord a very silly question when He requested me to move to the USA to live; "are you sure Lord?" He said "yes, I am sure; I do not make mistakes."
